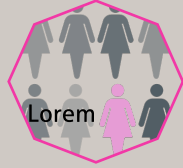

BREAST HEALTH SNAPSHOT

A brief overview of how Coosa County is doing in the fight against breast cancer

It is currently not possible to categorize Coosa County due to a lack of available data. The lack of late-stage diagnosis of breast cancer and breast cancer mortality rate data makes it difficult to determine the county's progress towards meeting the Healthy People 2020 targets for breast cancer outcomes.

Healthy People 2020 (HP 2020) is a set of health-related targets for the country that is developed by various U.S. federal agencies. The HP 2020 target for late-stage diagnosis is **38.9 new cases per 100,000 women**. The target for breast cancer mortality is **20.7 deaths per 100,000 women**.

Coosa County has an **incidence rate of 97.1 new cases of breast cancer per 100,000 women** and sees, on average, about 8 new cases of breast cancer diagnosed each year.

The lack of breast health outcomes data for Coosa County highlights a dire need for increased tracking and reporting in the county.
