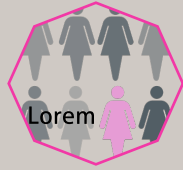




Screening Mammography

BREAST HEALTH SNAPSHOT

A brief overview of how Marion County is doing in the fight against breast cancer

Marion County is currently considered a "highest" risk county in the state. This means that the county is not currently meeting the Healthy People 2020 targets for late-stage diagnosis of breast cancer and breast cancer mortality.

Healthy People 2020 (HP 2020) is a set of health-related targets for the country that is developed by various U.S. federal agencies. The HP 2020 target for late-stage diagnosis is 38.9 new cases per 100,000 women. The target for breast cancer mortality is 20.7 deaths per 100,000 women. As it stands today, it is predicted that it Marion County will not meet these two target by 2020.

Marion County has an incidence rate of 110.2 new cases of breast cancer per 100,000 women and sees, on average, about 23 new cases of breast cancer diagnosed each year.

Some of the most influential factors impacting the state of breast health in Marion County include access to care barriers, low health literacy, and its rural location.
