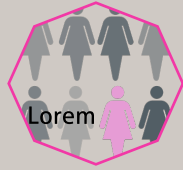




Screening Mammography

BREAST HEALTH SNAPSHOT

A brief overview of how Randolph County is doing in the fight against breast cancer

Randolph County is currently considered a "highest" risk county in the state. The county is not currently meeting the Healthy People 2020 target for late-stage diagnosis of breast cancer and there is currently no data on the county's progress toward the breast cancer mortality rate target.

Healthy People 2020 (HP 2020) is a set of health-related targets for the country that is developed by various U.S. federal agencies. The HP 2020 target for late-stage diagnosis is 38.9 new cases per 100,000 women. The target for breast cancer mortality is 20.7 deaths per 100,000 women. As it stands today, it is predicted that

Randolph County will not meet the late-stage diagnosis rate target by 2020.

Randolph County has an incidence rate of 103.9 new cases of breast cancer per 100,000 women and sees, on average, about 16 new cases of breast cancer diagnosed each year.

Some of the most influential factors impacting the state of breast health in Randolph County include access to care barriers, low health literacy, and its rural location.
