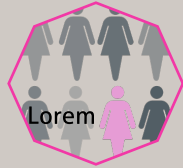




Screening Mammography

BREAST HEALTH SNAPSHOT

A brief overview of how Sumter County is doing in the fight against breast cancer

Sumter County is currently considered a "highest" risk county in the state. There is not currently a sufficient amount of breast health mortality nor late-stage diagnosis of breast cancer data available for the county but the Affiliate has placed it in the "highest" category because it has similar conditions and outcomes as other "highest" category counties.

Healthy People 2020 (HP 2020) is a set of health-related targets for the country that is developed by various U.S. federal agencies. The HP 2020 target for late-stage diagnosis is 38.9 new cases per 100,000 women. The target for breast cancer mortality is 20.7

deaths per 100,000 women. As it stands today, there is insufficient data to form a prediction about whether Sumter County will meet either of these targets by 2020.

Sumter County has an incidence rate of 94.1 new cases of breast cancer per 100,000 women and sees, on average, about 9 new cases of breast cancer diagnosed each year.

Some of the most influential factors impacting the state of breast health in Sumter County include access to care barriers, low health literacy, its rural location, and cultural myths and stigmas.
